WHEREAS, AUGUSTUS “GUS” H. TULLOSS, has dedicated his life to serving the citizens of Nash County, North Carolina and for the last twelve years has served as a Board Member of the North Carolina Board of Transportation; and

WHEREAS, during his tenure as a member of the Board of Transportation from January 1, 2008 until July 30, 2020, Gus Tulloss, has always worked diligently to represent the needs of Nash County citizens with enthusiasm and dedication, and is always available to assist wherever called upon; and

Description of the Subject Property:

The subject property is a 1.02 acre portion of a larger, approximately 15.8 acre tract of land owned by Erader A. Mills, Jr. and located at 8256 Savage Road, Spring Hope, NC 27882.

The property is located north of the Town of Spring Hope on the east side of the Erader Mills Septic Tank Company in a GI (General Industrial) Zoning District.

The subject property includes an existing single-wide manufactured home, which is considered a legal, nonconforming land use - meaning that although manufactured homes are not currently permitted in the GI Zoning District, this one was established prior to the adoption of those regulations.

The site is located within the Tar-Pamlico River Basin, it is not located within a regulated floodplain or a designated watershed protection overlay district, and it does not include any riparian stream buffers. No public water or sewer service is currently available in this area, so the site is served by a private well and an onsite septic system.

Description of the Rezoning Request:

The property owner plans to subdivide the subject property (as shown on the submitted survey plat) and to replace the existing single-wide manufactured home with a newly constructed single-family dwelling.

The Nash County Unified Development Ordinance (UDO) Article VI, Section 6-3, Subsection 6-3.3 (B) permits the replacement of a single-family residential nonconforming land use (including a manufactured home) with a similar or larger single-family residential structure. However, Subsection 6-3.2 (C) also specifies that: "*No such nonconforming use shall be moved in whole or in part to any portion of the lot or parcel other than that occupied by such use at the effective date of adoption or amendment of this Ordinance.*"

The property owner plans to construct the new single-family dwelling behind the current location of the existing single-wide manufactured home (as opposed to in the same location) and has submitted General Rezoning Request Z-200801 in order to rezone the subject property from GI (General Industrial) to A1 (Agricultural).

The A1 (Agricultural) Zoning District is primarily intended to accommodate agricultural land uses as well as farm residences and scattered non-farm residences, including manufactured homes, located on large tracts of land (UDO Article IX, Section 9-1, Subsection 9-1.1 A.)

Approval of the rezoning request would:

- (1) Recognize the proposed new single-family dwelling as a permitted land use;**
- (2) Allow the proposed new single-family dwelling to be constructed behind the current location of the existing single-wide manufactured home;**
- (3) Reduce the required minimum front building setback from 75 feet to 50 feet while slightly increasing the minimum side building setback from 10 feet to 15 feet and increasing the minimum rear building setback from 20 feet to 30 feet; and**
- (4) Restrict the future development of the subject property to only those land uses permitted by the A1 (Agricultural) Zoning District instead of the wide range of intensive assembling, fabricating, and manufacturing land uses currently permitted by the GI (General Industrial) Zoning District.**

Previous Rezoning Action:

On July 8, 2013 the Board of Commissioners **APPROVED** a similar request made by the same property owner to rezone the one acre lot located at 8416 Savage Road on the west side of the industrial site from GI (General Industrial) to A1 (Agricultural) in order to permit the construction of a single-family dwelling (Case File #Z-130601.)

Land Development Plan Consistency:

General Rezoning Request Z-200801 is consistent with the recommendations of the Nash County Land Development Plan (LDP) because:

- (1) The LDP designates the subject property as a Suburban Growth Area.
- (2) The primarily agricultural and residential land uses permitted by the requested A1 (Agricultural) Zoning District are more consistent with the land uses recommended by the LDP for the Suburban Growth Area than the wide range of more intensive assembling, fabricating, and manufacturing land uses permitted by the current GI (General Industrial) Zoning District.

Spot Zoning Analysis:

General Rezoning Request Z-200801 is not “spot zoning” because:

- (1) The request is an expansion of the large and immediately adjacent existing A1 (Agricultural) Zoning District.
- (2) The request is consistent with the recommendations of the Nash County Land Development Plan as established above.
- (3) The request is an example of voluntary “downzoning,” meaning that the proposed A1 (Agricultural) Zoning District is more restrictive in terms of land uses than the current, more intensive GI (General Industrial) Zoning District.

TRC Recommendation:

The Nash County Technical Review Committee (TRC) considered General Rezoning Request Z-200801 on July 31, 2020 and recommended **APPROVAL** based on the determination that the request is consistent with the recommendations of the Nash County Land Development Plan and not “spot zoning.”

Planning Board Recommendation:

The Nash County Planning Board considered General Rezoning Request Z-200801 on August 17, 2020. No members of the public, other than a representative for the applicant, addressed the Board with regard to this request.

The Planning Board voted unanimously to recommend:

- (1) **APPROVAL of Consistency Statement ‘A’ below** – finding the request to be reasonable, in the public interest, consistent with the recommendations of the Nash County Land Development Plan, and not “spot zoning;” and
- (2) **APPROVAL** of the request to rezone 1.02 acres at 8256 Savage Rd from GI (General Industrial) to A1 (Agricultural).



Description of the Request:


N.C. Department of Transportation (NCDOT) District Engineer Bobby Liverman, P.E. has submitted a petition requesting the adoption of a resolution by the Nash County Board of Commissioners to request that the NCDOT Division of Highways add **Magnolia Road** and **Mattie Road** to the State Maintained Secondary Road System, provided that the roads meet the minimum established standards and criteria.

Both **Magnolia Road** and **Mattie Road** are 50' public rights-of-way located off the south side of Preacher Joyner Road, which were constructed and dedicated in 2005 by Ferrell Homes, Inc. (Wayne Ferrell) in relation to the development of Section Two of the Magnolia Plantation Subdivision.



The NCDOT District Engineer has determined that both roads satisfy the applicable construction standards and eligibility criteria for addition to the State Maintained Secondary Road System, with the exception of the western cul-de-sac of **Mattie Road**, which has been omitted from the request due to an unresolved issue related to the existing, nonconforming residential driveways.

Magnolia Plantation Subdivision, Section Two**





Description:

The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality administers a grant program for publicly operated water and sewer systems to complete projects related to asset inventory and assessment efforts. These grants, which include awards up to \$150,000 per utility, are available on a competitive basis to utilities across the state. The next round of applications are due in the Fall of 2020. In order to pursue these funds, the governing body is required to adopt a resolution of intent to apply for these funds.

Subject: AIA Grant Application for Asset Inventory and Assessment (AIA) Project

The North Carolina Department of Environmental Quality administers a grant program for jurisdictions with public water and sewer systems to advance their efforts to effectively operate and maintain these systems. At present, Nash County does not have a comprehensive basemap for its water and sewer system in a geographic information system (GIS). In addition to providing a graphical interface for these two systems, a GIS would allow for key characteristics of these systems to be captured and attached to the individual elements that comprise the system. Examples include pipe size, material, manufacturer, installation date, most recent inspection date, and other pertinent data.

In order to advance the county's interest in this area, the Public Utilities and Facilities Department proposes to apply for two (2) \$150,000 grants to be used for this purpose. The county applied for these same grant funds in 2019 and just narrowly missed being selected. Based on the previous applications and work completed over the past year, the department is optimistic that the county will be successful during the upcoming round of grant funding.

As before, the first step in this process is to have the Board of Commissioners adopt the attached resolutions which establish the county's intent to pursue this grant funding. Although the grants require a local match, based on the county's population, utility rates, and socioeconomic data, it is expected that the grants would require a 10% match. It is important to note, however, that this match would be composed of a 1.5% cash match (\$2,250 maximum per grant) and an 8.5% in-kind services match.

Based on the identified need and the terms of the AIA Grant Funded Program, the Public Utilities Department recommends that the Board of Commissioners approve the attached resolutions and authorize the Chair of the Board of Commissioners to execute same on behalf the county.

Item: Establishment of a Natural Resource Resilience Committee

Initiated By: Edward Long, Soil and Water Director

Action Proposed: Approve the Establishment of the Committee

Description:

Nash County citizens have had a history of issues with flooding due to debris in our rivers, streams and creeks. Tropical storms and hurricanes take an annual toll on our aquatic environments. They create flooding for property owners living along waterways and water covered roadways make for dangerous driving conditions for all of our citizens.

Since September of 2017, Nash County has successfully reached out and written grants for funds to clean out debris from our waterways. Over the past three years, Nash County has secured \$518,265 to complete projects to clean debris from Stoney Creek, the Tar River and Turkey Creek. We have also engaged the USDA's Beaver Dam Removal Program and are currently trapping beavers and removing beaver dams. A future project is planned to perform stream debris removal on Fishing Creek.

The need for these projects will be continuous and other issues with flooding and standing water such as mosquitos will remain issues for Nash County to mitigate. Therefore, it is suggested that Nash County develop a committee that will be focused on these on-going problems. Below is a suggested outline for the establishment of such a committee and I welcome any input Board Members have.

Proposed Committee: Natural Resource Resilience Committee

Purpose: The purpose of the committee is to serve as an advisory committee to the Nash County Commissioners on issues that may develop before, during, or after highwater events or other environmental issues that may arise.

Members: Willie Harrison, Nash Soil & Water Conservation District Board Member
Lori Boone, Nash County Environmental Health
NC Forest Service Representative
Edward Long, Nash Soil & Water Conservation District
Tim Bartholomew, Citizen
Bill Lewis, Citizen

Meeting Frequency: Bimonthly

Committee Objectives:

- Develop strategies to mitigate high water events and issues that arise with these events.
- Identify areas that have reoccurring events and offer possible solutions or options for those affected.
- Educate the public on how to become more resilient to these events.

Long-term Goal: To offer viable strategies and plans that could be implemented to mitigate the effects of highwater events in Nash County.

MONTHLY REPORT OF TAX COLLECTOR

Among the duties of the Tax Collector is:

G.S. 105 – 350 (7) to submit to the governing body at each of its regular meetings a report of the amount he has collected on each year's taxes with which he is charged, the amount remaining uncollected and the steps he is taking to encourage or enforce payment of uncollected taxes.

STEPS BEING TAKEN TO COLLECT:

All legal enforcement procedures prescribed by law including garnishment, levy attachment to bank account, certifying to other counties and foreclosure of real estate.
